Summer revision work for Form III

These questions are meant to cover the chapters we covered in the past scholastic year.

Use the notes for revising and as reference to answer the questions. I suggest you answer each question in paragraph form, (100-120 words).

1. Divine Revelation is at the basis of what we believe as Christians. Why is this so?
2. The Bible has two authors: God and man. Explain?
3. What do we mean by 'the Bible is inspired by God'?
4. The biblical authors used various literary forms. What are these and what was their function in the writing of the Bible?
5. Even though the Bible was written by various authors, it is seen as one big book. Explain.
6. What attitude should one adopt so as to acquire a better understanding of the Bible?
7. Reading through the notes, make a summary of the main points of the Babylonian exile.
8. Write notes about: Abraham, Jacob, Joseph and Solomon.
9. Write about the differences that one finds in the two creation stories.
10. List the consequences of sin and write about them.
11. What literary form do we find in the two different creation stories? Why did the author use them?

12. The first chapters of Genesis were not written merely to narrate a story but to pass on a religious message. Make a list of the truths of the first and second creation story.
13. What was the role of the Old Testament prophets? Why is Moses considered to be one of the greatest prophets?
14. Reading through page 2 and 3 of the chapter 'the God who Saves' in the notes, what do we consider to be the main theme of the Book of Exodus.
